NOTICE – SPECIAL ATTENTION

§653. Hearings; bureau review; appeal

- 1. Hearings. The municipal officers or, in the case of unincorporated places, the county commissioners of the county in which the unincorporated place is located, may hold a public hearing for the consideration of applications for new on-premises licenses and applications for transfer of location of existing on-premises licenses. The municipal officers or county commissioners may hold a public hearing for the consideration of requests for renewal of licenses, except that when an applicant has held a license for the prior 5 years and a complaint has not been filed against the applicant within that time, the applicant may request a waiver of the hearing.
 - A. The bureau shall prepare and supply application forms. [1993, c. 730, §27 (AMD).]
- B. The municipal officers or the county commissioners, as the case may be, shall provide public notice of any hearing held under this section by causing a notice, at the applicant's prepaid expense, stating the name and place of hearing, to appear on at least 3 consecutive days before the date of hearing in a daily newspaper having general circulation in the municipality where the premises are located or one week before the date of the hearing in a weekly newspaper having general circulation in the municipality where the premises are located. [1995, c. 140, §4 (AMD).]
- C. If the municipal officers or the county commissioners, as the case may be, fail to take final action on an application for a new on-premises license or transfer of the location of an existing on-premises license within 60 days of the filing of an application, the application is deemed approved and ready for action by the bureau. For purposes of this paragraph, the date of filing of the application is the date the application is received by the municipal officers or county commissioners. This paragraph applies to all applications pending before municipal officers or county commissioners as of the effective date of this paragraph as well as all applications filed on or after the effective date of this paragraph. This paragraph applies to an existing on-premises license that has been extended pending renewal. The municipal officers or the county commissioners shall take final action on an on-premises license that has been extended pending renewal within 120 days of the filing of the application. [2003, c. 213, \$1 (AMD).]
- D. If an application is approved by the municipal officers or the county commissioners but the bureau finds, after inspection of the premises and the records of the applicant, that the applicant does not qualify for the class of license applied for, the bureau shall notify the applicant of that fact in writing. The bureau shall give the applicant 30 days to file an amended application for the appropriate class of license, accompanied by any additional license

fee, with the municipal officers or county commissioners, as the case may be. If the applicant fails to file an amended application within 30 days, the original application must be denied by the bureau. The bureau shall notify the applicant in writing of its decision to deny the application including the reasons for the denial and the rights of appeal of the applicant. [1995, c. 140, §5 (NEW).][2003, c. 213, §1 (AMD) .]

- 2. Findings. In granting or denying an application, the municipal officers or the county commissioners shall indicate the reasons for their decision and provide a copy to the applicant. A license may be denied on one or more of the following grounds:
 - A. Conviction of the applicant of any Class A, Class B or Class C crime; [1987, c. 45, Pt. A, §4 (NEW).]
- B. Noncompliance of the licensed premises or its use with any local zoning ordinance or other land use ordinance not directly related to liquor control; [1987, c. 45, Pt. A, §4 (NEW).]
- C. Conditions of record such as waste disposal violations, health or safety violations or repeated parking or traffic violations on or in the vicinity of the licensed premises and caused by persons patronizing or employed by the licensed premises or other such conditions caused by persons patronizing or employed by the licensed premises that unreasonably disturb, interfere with or affect the ability of persons or businesses residing or located in the vicinity of the licensed premises to use their property in a reasonable manner; [1993, c. 730, §27 (AMD).]
- D. Repeated incidents of record of breaches of the peace, disorderly conduct, vandalism or other violations of law on or in the vicinity of the licensed premises and caused by persons patronizing or employed by the licensed premises; [1989, c. 592, §3 (AMD).]
 - E. A violation of any provision of this Title; [2009, c. 81, \$1 (AMD).]
- F. A determination by the municipal officers or county commissioners that the purpose of the application is to circumvent the provisions of section 601; and [2009, c. 81, §2 (AMD).]
- G. After September 1, 2010, server training, in a program certified by the bureau and required by local ordinance, has not been completed by individuals who serve alcoholic beverages. [2009, c. 81, §3 (NEW).]

 [2009, c. 81, §\$1-3 (AMD) .]
- 3. Appeal to bureau. Any applicant aggrieved by the decision of the municipal officers or county commissioners under this section may appeal to the bureau within 15 days of the receipt of the written decision of the municipal officers or county commissioners. The bureau shall hold a public hearing in the city, town or unincorporated place where the premises are situated. In acting on such an appeal, the bureau may consider all licensure requirements and findings referred to in subsection 2.
 - A. [1993, c. 730, \$27 (RP).]
- B. If the decision appealed from is an application denial, the bureau may issue the license only if it finds by clear and convincing evidence that the decision was without justifiable cause. [1993, c.730, \$27 (AMD).] [1995, c.140, \$6 (AMD).]
 - 4. No license to person who moved to obtain a license. [1987, c. 342, \$32 (RP) .]
- 5. Appeal to District Court. Any person or governmental entity aggrieved by a bureau decision under this section may appeal the decision to the District Court within 30 days of receipt of the written decision of the bureau.

An applicant who files an appeal or who has an appeal pending shall pay the annual license fee the applicant would otherwise pay. Upon resolution of the appeal, if an applicant's license renewal is denied, the bureau shall refund the applicant the prorated amount of the unused license fee.





Restricted Vehicle Weight on Posted Roadways


The Town of Kennebunkport has authorized the closing of certain town ways to any non-exempt vehicle or combination of vehicles registered for a gross weight of over 23,000 pounds. The following roads will be closed to such traffic commencing on March 1, 2017 and will remain closed until at least April 24, 2017, unless postings are removed by the Town of Kennebunkport. Any violation of the rules is a traffic infraction punishable by a fine of not less than \$250. Home Heating Fuel Delivery Trucks and Municipal Solid Waste Collection Trucks are exempt from Posted Road regulations. The posting shall remain in force except when the way is solidly frozen. The highway is considered solidly frozen only when the air temperature is 32 degrees F. or below and no water is showing in the cracks in the road. Both conditions must be met.

The Town of Kennebunkport will be posting restricted vehicle weight signs on the following roads:

- * River Road from Goff Brook to North Street
- * Beachwood Avenue from North Street to Route 9
- * Walkers Lane from North Street to Beachwood Avenue

- * Stone Road from Beachwood Avenue to Goose Rocks Road
- * Guinea Road from Goose Rocks Road to Biddeford Line
- * Whitten Hill Road from Goose Rocks Road to Guinea Road
- * Maine Street from Elm Street to Wildes District Road
- * Pier Road
- * New Biddeford Road from Route 9 to Kings Highway
- * Winter Harbor Road from Route 9 to New Biddeford Road

- * Wildes District Road

Attached for your review, please find proposed changes to the Shellfish Conservation Ordinance.

The first revision is in the first paragraph of Section 3. It clarifies that the Shellfish Warden may be part of the Shellfish Conservation Committee even if he is not a resident of Kennebunkport.

The next change can be found in Section 7. The second and third paragraphs add language at the request of the State Department of Marine Resources. It will ensure that any enforcement of illegal harvesting in conservation closed areas can be handled by local authorities.

KENNEBUNKPORT SHELLFISH CONSERVATION ORDINANCE

- 1. Authority: This Ordinance is enacted in accordance with 12 M.R.S.A. §6671.
- 2. <u>Purpose</u>: To establish a shellfish conservation program for the Town of Kennebunkport that will insure the protection and optimum utilization of shellfish resources within its limits. These goals will be achieved by means that may include:
 - a. Licensing
 - b. Limiting the number of shellfish harvesters
 - c. Restricting the time and area where digging is permitted
 - d. Limiting the minimum size of clams taken
 - e. Limiting the amount of clams taken daily by a harvester
- 3. <u>Shellfish Conservation Committee</u>: The Shellfish Conservation Program for the Town of Kennebunkport will be administered by the Shellfish Conservation Committee consisting of a minimum of five (5) members and a maximum of seven (7) members, including the Shellfish Warden who may be a non-resident, to be appointed by the Selectmen of the Town of Kennebunkport for terms of three (3) years. No more than three (3) members shall possess current commercial shellfish licenses. The Shellfish Conservation Warden may not posses a Commercial Shellfish License.

The Committee's responsibilities include:

- a. Establishing annually in conjunction with the Department of Marine Resources the number of shellfish digging licenses to be issued.
- b. Surveying each clam-producing area at least once each three-years to establish size distribution and density, and annually estimating the status of the Town's shellfish conservation.
- c. Submitting to the Board of Selectmen proposals for the expenditures of funds for the purpose of shellfish conservation.
- d. Keeping this Ordinance under review and making recommendations for its amendments.
- e. Securing and maintaining records of shellfish harvest from the Town's managed shellfish areas and closed areas that are conditionally opened by the Department of Marine Resources.
- f. Recommending conservation closures and openings to the Board of Selectmen in conjunction with the Area Biologists of the Department of Marine Resources.
- g. Submitting an annual report to the municipality and the Department of Marine Resources covering the above topics and all other committee activities.

h. Recommending daily harvest limits to the Board of Selectmen.

4. **Definitions**

- a. Resident: The term "resident" refers to a person who has been domiciled in this municipality for at least three months next prior to the time his claim of such residence is made.
- b. <u>Nonresident</u>: The term "nonresident" means anyone not qualified as a resident under this Ordinance.
- c. <u>Shellfish, Clams and Intertidal Shellfish Resources</u>: When used in the context of this Ordinance, the words "shellfish," clams," and "intertidal shellfish resources" mean soft shell clams (Mya arenaria).
- d. <u>Municipality</u>: Refers to the Town of Kennebunkport, Maine.
- e. <u>Shellfish Conservation Warden:</u> When used in the context of this Ordinance, the words "Shellfish Warden" and "Clam Warden" mean Shellfish Conservation Warden.
- 5. <u>Licensing</u>: Municipal Shellfish Digging License is required. It is unlawful for any person to dig or take shellfish from the shores and flats of this municipality without having a current license issued by this municipality as provided by this Ordinance.
 - a. <u>Designation, Scope and Qualifications</u>:
 - i. Resident Recreational Shellfish License: The license is available to residents and real estate taxpayers of this municipality and entitles the holder to dig and take no more than one peck of shellfish in any one day for the use of himself and his family.
 - ii. Nonresident Recreational Shellfish License: The license is available to any person not a resident of this municipality and entitles the holder to dig and take not more than one peck of shellfish in any one day for the use of himself and his family.
 - iii. Resident Commercial Shellfish License: The license is available to residents of this municipality and entitles the holder to dig and take no more than the amount of shellfish as recommended by the Shellfish Conservation Committee and approved by the Board of Selectmen in any one day, unassisted only. Commercial license holders must keep a daily log of clams harvested. This license shall be revoked if the license holder ceases to reside in the municipality.

- iv. Non-resident Commercial Shellfish License: The license is available to nonresidents of this municipality and entitles the holder to dig and take no more than the amount of shellfish as recommended by the Shellfish Conservation Committee and approved by the Board of Selectmen in any one day, unassisted only. Commercial license holders must keep a daily log of clams harvested.
- v. <u>Daily Recreational Shellfish License</u>: The license is available to residents and non-residents of this municipality and entitles the holder to dig and take no more than one peck of shellfish in any one day for the use of himself and his family. The license is good only for the date stated on the license.
- vi. <u>License must be signed</u>: The licensee must sign the license to make it valid.
- b. <u>Application Procedure</u>: Any person may apply to the Town Clerk for the licenses required by this Ordinance on forms provided by the municipality.
 - i. <u>Contents of Application</u>: The application must be in the form of an affidavit and must contain the applicant's name, current address, birth date, height, weight, signature and whatever information the municipality may require.
 - ii. <u>Misrepresentation</u>: Any person who gives false information on a license application will cause said license to become invalid and void.
- <u>Fees</u>: The fees for the licenses shall be set by the Municipal Officers upon the approval of the Commissioner of the Department of Marine Resources and must accompany in full the application for the respective license. The Town Clerk shall pay all fees received to the Town Treasurer. Fees received for shellfish licensing shall be used by the Town for shellfish management, conservation and enforcement.
- d. <u>Limitation of Diggers</u>: Clam resources vary in density and size distribution from year to year and over the limited soft clam-producing area of the Town. It is essential that the Town carefully husband its shellfish resources. Following the annual review of the Town's clam resources, its size distribution, abundance, and the Warden's reports, as required by Section 3, the Shellfish Conservation Committee in consultation with the D.M.R. Area Biologist will determine whether limiting commercial or recreational shellfish licenses is an appropriate shellfish management option for the following year.
 - i. Prior to January 1, the Committee shall report its findings and document recommendations for the allocation of commercial and recreational

- licenses to be made available for the following license-year to the Commissioner of Marine Resources for concurrence.
- ii. After receiving approval of proposed license allocations from the Commissioner of Marine Resources and prior to January 1, the Shellfish Conservation Committee shall notify the Town Clerk in writing of the number and allocation of shellfish licenses to be issued.
- iii. Notice of the number of licenses to be issued and the procedure for application shall be published in a trade or industry publication, or in a newspaper or combination of newspapers with general circulation that the Municipal Officers consider effective in reaching persons affected, not less than ten (10) days prior to the period of issuance. This information shall also be posted in the municipal offices until the period concludes.
- iv. The Town Clerk shall issue licenses to residents and nonresidents as allocated (paragraph 5.D.1) from January 1 and until March 31 after which license shall be issued without regard to residency on a first come, first served basis or by lottery.
- e. <u>License Expiration Date</u>: Each license issued under authority of this Ordinance expires at midnight on the December 31st next following date of issuance. Each daily license issued under the authority of this Ordinance shall be valid only for the date stated on the license.
- f. <u>Reciprocal Harvesting Privileges</u>: Licenses from any other municipality cooperating with this municipality on a joint shellfish management program may harvest shellfish according to the terms of this license.
- g. <u>License Fee Waiver</u>: Recreational shellfish license fees will be waived for residents 65 years or older and 12 years or younger.
- h. A shellfish license is not available to anyone whose municipal or state shellfish license is under suspension or who has been convicted of violating Maine marine statutes or state wildlife statutes within a prior 24-month period or who has a valid commercial license in another Maine municipality.
- i. <u>Suspension/Revocation</u>: A shellfish license issued under this Ordinance is subject to suspension as follows:
 - i. In cases where a court enforcement proceeding is brought under this Ordinance or State law:
 - a. in the case of a first court judgment finding any violation, an automatic suspension of 60 days;

- b. in the case of a second court judgment finding any violation against the same licensee, an automatic revocation of the existing license, and the person found in violation is prohibited from reapplying for a license under this Ordinance for one year.
- ii. In cases where the Shellfish Warden believes that a licensee has violated this Ordinance, he may give notice to the licensee of such belief. If, after providing the licensee with an opportunity to rebut any evidence he has, the Clam Warden concludes that a violation has occurred, he may issue a notice of suspension not to exceed 30 days.
 - a. A licensee who has received a notice of suspension may appeal to the Board of Selectmen by filing a written request with the Town Clerk within seven (7) days of the day the Clam Warden's decision is rendered. Upon filing the request, the suspension is stayed pending the Board's decision.
 - b. The Board of Selectmen shall hear the appeal as soon as practicable and shall provide the appellant with at least 7 days written notice of hearing. It shall hear all the evidence and decide whether to uphold or reverse the decision of the Clam Warden. The rules of evidence do not apply.
- 6. <u>Conservation Credits</u>: A licensed commercial shellfish harvester must obtain a total of ten (10) conservation credit points between January 1 and December 31 in order to remain eligible to obtain a license for the next licensing period.

Documented certification in any of the following activities results in granting of conversation credit as specified:

Participation in any one (1) of the following activities shall deem a harvester eligible to receive five conservation credit points per activity:

- a. Participation in a Kennebunkport Shellfish Conservation Committee sponsored shellfish re-seeding project.
- b. Participation in a Kennebunkport Shellfish Conservation Committee sponsored shellfish survey.

If the Kennebunkport Shellfish Conservation Committee does not sponsor both activity 6(a) and 6(b) above during a single calendar year then participation in the single activity sponsored shall be valued at ten (10) conservation credit points.

All records and conservation credit logs will be maintained by the shellfish warden and will be held in the shellfish warden's office.

Determination of conservation credit completion - By the first business day of January the shellfish warden shall compile documented conservation time of each individual harvester and forward a list of those harvesters determined to have satisfied the conservation credit requirement to the Town Clerk.

Harvesters included on the list submitted by the shellfish warden shall be eligible for a commercial license for the upcoming license year if a notice of intent has been filed by the deadline.

Harvesters will be notified of their status in terms of conservation credit completeness by the shellfish warden by December 1 for credits earned. A final status will be mailed by December 10.

Approved absence from conservation credit requirement - Harvesters who have not completed a full ten (10) points of conservation credit in a given license year are only eligible for a license if their absence from participation in conservation credit activities is approved by the shellfish warden or marine resource committee.

Approved absences may include an extended and documented illness, or an extended illness of an immediate family member that is under the immediate care of the harvester.

Requests for a determination of approved absence must be made in writing to the shellfish warden and must be submitted no later than December 15. The request shall include evidence to support an approval of absence determination.

If the absence is approved, the harvester will be required to make up the remaining conservation credit points during the next license year.

If the absence is not approved, the harvester will not be eligible to obtain a license.

Appeal procedure - A harvester may appeal any determination of eligibility made by the shellfish warden. Request for appeals must be made in writing to the Shellfish Conservation Committee by December 31. Appeals will be decided by the Shellfish Conservation Committee during its January meeting. Decisions shall be provided to the town clerk in writing no later than five (5) days after the meeting.

7. Opening and Closing of Flats: The Municipal Officers, upon the approval of the Commissioner of Marine Resources, may open and close areas for shellfish harvest. Upon recommendations of the Shellfish Conservation Committee and concurrence of the Department of Marine Resources Area Biologist that the status of shellfish resource and other factors bearing on sound management indicate that an area should be opened or closed, the Municipal Officers may call a public hearing, and shall send a copy of the notice to the Department of Marine Resources. The decision of the Municipal Officers made after the hearing shall be based on findings of fact.

It shall be unlawful for any person to harvest, take or possess shellfish from any areas closed by the Town of Kennebunkport in accordance with DMR Regulation, Chapter 7. Harvesting shellfish in a closed area is a violation of this municipality's ordinance and is punishable under MSRA Title 12 §6671.

Boundaries of conservation closures are explicitly defined in the conservation closure application submitted by the Town of Kennebunkport to DMR and are part of the resulting permit issued by DMR. These permits are posted at the town office and online: http://www.maine.gov/dmr/shellfish-sanition-management/programs/municipal/ordinances/towninfo.html.

8. <u>Minimum Legal Size of Soft Shell Clams</u>: It is unlawful for any person to possess soft shell clams within the Town of Kennebunkport, County of York, that are less than two (2) inches in the longest diameter except as provided by Subsection B of this section.

a. Definitions:

- i. <u>Lot</u>: The word "lot" as used in this Ordinance means the total number of soft shell clams in any bulk pile. Where soft shell clams are in a box, barrel, or other container, the contents of each box, barrel, or other container constitutes a separate lot.
- ii. <u>Possess</u>: For the Purpose of this section, "possess" means dig, take, harvest, transport, or hold soft shell clam shellstock.
- b. <u>Tolerance</u>: Any person may possess soft shell clams that are less than two (2) inches if they comprise less than 10% of any lot.

9. Other Limitations:

- a. The placement of clams harvested under this section in a closed container is prohibited.
- b. The harvesting of clams is permitted only during daylight hours which shall be defined as between one hour prior to sunrise and one hour past sunset.
- 10. **Penalty:** A person who violates this Ordinance shall be punished as provided by 12 M.R.S.A. §6671 (10).
- 11. <u>Effective Date</u>: This Ordinance, which has been approved by the Commissioner of Marine Resources, shall become effective after its adoption by the municipality provided a certified copy of the Ordinance is filed with the Commissioner within twenty (20) days of its adoption.

- 12. **Period of Ordinance:** This Ordinance shall remain in effect until repealed by the Municipality or rescinded by the Commissioner of the Department of Marine Resources.
- 13. <u>Separability</u>: If any section, subsection, sentence or part of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional, such decisions shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance.
- 14. **Repeal:** Any ordinance regulating the harvesting or conservation of shellfish in the Town and any provisions of any other Town ordinance that is inconsistent with this Ordinance is hereby repealed.

To Whom It May Concern,

The Department of Marine Resources (DMR) has become aware of an issue that may affect your municipal shellfish ordinance and your municipality's ability to enforce conservation closures. All municipal shellfish ordinances should include explicit language identifying conservation closures and must also prohibit harvest within these areas. The municipal shellfish ordinance should include the following, or similar statements:

It shall be unlawful for any person to harvest, take or possess shellfish from any areas closed by the town of NAME in accordance with DMR Regulation, Chapter 7. Harvesting shellfish in a closed area is a violation of this municipality's ordinance and is punishable under MSRA Title 12 §6671.

Boundaries of conservation closures are explicitly defined in the conservation closure application submitted by the town of NAME to DMR and are part of the resulting permit issued by DMR. These permits are posted at the town office and online: http://www.maine.gov/dmr/shellfish-sanitation-management/programs/municipal/ordinances/towninfo.html.

The term "shellfish" should be defined in the municipal shellfish ordinance as those species included in the municipal shellfish conservation program (e.g. "Shellfish" means soft shelled clams).

DMR understands that ordinance changes often require a town meeting to adopt and encourage towns to add this language into their municipal shellfish ordinances as soon as practically possible. This will ensure that any enforcement of illegal harvesting in conservation closed areas can be addressed by the local authorities.

Attached for your review, please find a proposed change to the Administrative Code removing the requirement that the Shellfish Warden be a resident of the Town.

The proposed language was submitted by Wayne Adams, chair of the Administrative Code Committee.

Thank you for your consideration.

3.1.2 **Duties**

The duties of the Animal Control Officer shall be the enforcement of statutes relating to the duties of animal control officers and such other duties as may be required by the Board of Selectmen.

3.1.3 Compensation

The compensation of the Animal Control Officer shall be on the basis of a salary to be determined by the Board of selectmen and not otherwise.

3.2 SHELLFISH WARDEN

3.2.1 **Appointment**

The Board of Selectmen shall appoint annually a Shellfish Conservation Committee consisting of one or more persons.

3.2.2 Chairman

The Chairman of the Shellfish Conservation Committee shall be known and serve as the Shellfish Warden. The Shellfish Warden shall report directly to, and be supervised by, the Town Manager, or his or her designee. Nonwithstanding any other provision of this Administrative Code, the Chairman of the Shellfish Conservation Committee serving as Shellfish Warden shall not be required to be a resident of the Town.

3.2.3 Duties

The duties of the Shellfish Conservation Committee shall be as set forth in the Shellfish Conservation Ordinance of the Town of Kennebunkport.

3.3 EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT DIRECTOR

3.3.1 **Appointment**

The Board of Selectmen shall appoint annually the Emergency Management Director. The Emergency Management Director shall report directly to, and be supervised by, the Town Manager, or his or her designee.

TOWN OF KENNEBUNKPORT KEY LOCK BOX ORDINANCE

SECTION 1: TITLE.

This Ordinance shall be known as the Town of Kennebunkport Key Lock Box Ordinance (the "Ordinance").

SECTION 2: AUTHORITY.

This Ordinance is enacted in accordance with 30-A M.R.S.A 3001 et. seq., as may be amended.

SECTION 3: PURPOSE.

The Town of Kennebunkport determines that the health, safety and welfare of residents and property owners of the Town are promoted by a requirement that certain properties shall have a key lock box installed on the exterior of the structure(s) or at the gated entrance to aid the Kennebunkport Fire Department (KPFD) and Kennebunkport Emergency Medical Services (KEMS) with gaining access to or within a structure when responding to calls for emergency service, and to aid access into or within a building that is secured or is unduly difficult to gain entry to due to being either unoccupied or the occupants being unable to respond.

SECTION 4: DEFINITIONS.

Fire Chief: the person duly appointed as the Fire Chief of the Town of Kennebunkport.

Structure(s): a habitable space with floor to ceiling height of over 7'-0".

Key Lock Box: a secured box or vault of a size and style approved by the Fire Chief or his/her designee, which contains key(s) for the exclusive use of the KPFD and KEMS to access the property and premises in an emergency.

SECTION 5: INSTALLATION REQUIRED.

New Structures: The following structures built after October 1, 2017 shall be equipped with a key lock box at or near the main entrance or such other location as required by the Fire Chief or his/her designee:

- Commercial and industrial structure; and
- All structures, including residential structures, protected by an automatic fire alarm system or automatic suppression system; and All properties having a security gate at the vehicular entrance to the property.







We received an abatement application from Katherine Fisher of 25 Elizabethan Drive. Ms. Fisher received a mortgage appraisal of the property, and felt her assessment should be lowered to reflect the appraiser's opinion of value. Ms. Fisher requested a reduction of \$292,930 in assessed value.

We requested an opportunity to visit the property and complete an interior inspection of the home to ensure that all the information we have on file is accurate.

Upon completion of the inspection, we found several discrepancies, resulting in a reduction of \$134,000 in assessed value and an abatement of \$1,109.52 in taxes.

For your information, we have enclosed Ms. Fisher's application, along with our response.

It is our recommendation the abatement request be approved at your February 23, 2017 meeting.

This is in response to your request for abatement on your property identified as Map 20 Block 4 Lot 25, 25 Elizabethan Drive. I would like to first thank you for taking the time and allowing me to do an interior inspection of your property. As I mentioned, Donna Hays is the Assessors Agent for the Town of Kennebunkport, therefore any recommendations I have, regarding changes to property records are reviewed by Donna, before its presented to the Board of Selectmen/Assessors.

After reviewing the information, we added the additional kitchen, and removed the duplicate patio entry. We also considered the overall condition of the property and the damp basement, which resulted in an additional 5% reduction to the functionality of the property. After the adjustments, your value is reduced to \$880,000, which will be an abatement of \$1,109.52 in taxes.

It will be our recommendation to the Board of Selectmen/Assessors that this abatement be granted at their February 23rd, 2017 meeting.

ANIMAL SHELTER AGREEMENT, KENNEBUNKPORT

This agreement (the "Agreement") is by and between the Animal Welfare Society, Inc., a non-profit corporation organized and existing under the laws of the State of Maine (herein-after "AWS"), Old Holland Road, West Kennebunk, Maine and the Town of Kennebunkport, Maine (hereafter "Municipality") (collectively, "Parties"). The terms of this Agreement shall take effect on July 1, 2017 and shall remain in effect through June 30, 2018.

WHEREAS, Municipality is required under the laws of the State of Maine to provide shelter at a State licensed animal control shelter (7 M.R.S. § 3949) for stray and lost domesticated companion animals (hereinafter "Animal" or "Animals"); and

WHEREAS, Municipality is required under the laws of the State of Maine to provide services relating to the humane disposition of said Animals in the event they are not claimed by their owners; and

WHEREAS, AWS operates an animal shelter as defined in 7 M.R.S. §3907, which is a suitable facility for the housing and/or disposition of said Animals (hereinafter, the "Shelter") but is not a suitable facility for the housing and/or disposition of any living, sentient creature that is not an Animal;

NOW THEREFORE, the Parties hereby agree as follows:

- 1. AWS will confine such Animals as may be delivered to it by an authorized agent of the Municipality for the legal impoundment period. At the end of this period, AWS will make such a disposition as it seems fit in accordance with 7 M.R.S. §§3912, 3913, et. seq. AWS may refuse delivery of any living, sentient creature that, in the sole and exclusive judgment of AWS, is not an Animal.
- 2. Delivery of said Animals shall be accepted from the Municipality's Animal Control Officer/Police from 7:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Sunday through Saturday ("Regular Business Hours"). Police and/or Animal Control Officer will be issued a key to an after hours holding room at the Shelter. Persons may deliver Animals found within the boundaries of the Municipality to the Shelter during Regular Business Hours. Animals delivered to AWS by Municipality's Animal Control Officer or Police after hours shall be placed by the person delivering the Animal in pens, kennels, or crates made available in the holding room by AWS for that purpose, to the extent such materials are available to AWS. It is the responsibility of the Police and/or Animal Control Officer delivering an Animal after

hours to provide bedding, food, and water for said Animal as supplied by AWS, to the extent such materials are available to AWS. Where delivery of one or more Animals by the Municipality's Animal Control Officer or Police renders the Shelter unable to humanely confine such Animals in the holding room, the delivering Animal Control Officer or Police shall communicate with designated AWS personnel prior to delivery to verify AWS's ability to confine such Animals. AWS alone retains sole discretion to refuse delivery of one or more Animals where such delivery renders AWS unable to provide appropriate housing and/or disposition of delivered Animals.

- 3. Police and Animal Control Officers shall take a stray or lost Animal to its owner, if known, or, if the owner is unknown, to the Shelter. Municipality agrees that all Animals apprehended and seized within the boundaries of the Municipality and delivered to the Shelter shall be under the exclusive control and custody of AWS. Moreover, Municipality agrees that AWS shall have the undisputed right, consistent with the laws of the State of Maine, to humanely dispose of every Animal given into its custody in accordance with State laws and the policies and procedures of AWS.
- 4. AWS will not accept delivery of any injured Animal that has not received proper veterinary care. Municipality agrees that it shall obtain appropriate veterinary care for injured Animals prior to delivery to AWS. In the event that Municipality delivers an injured Animal to the Shelter without first obtaining appropriate veterinary care, AWS, in its sole discretion, may elect either to refuse acceptance of such Animal or to accept delivery of such Animal and procure the veterinary care it deems necessary and appropriate. Municipality agrees to reimburse AWS for the costs of emergency and required veterinary care within ten (10) days from the receipt of an invoice. At no time will the Municipality deliver any injured Animal to the Shelter during hours other than Regular Business Hours unless Municipality has made prior arrangements with AWS.
- 5. The Municipality agrees to and shall indemnify and hold harmless AWS for any claims arising out of actions and/or inactions of the Municipality's Police Officers and Animal Control Officers in the capturing, detaining, processing, documenting and delivery of any Animal under this Agreement, and for any violation by the Municipality's Animal Control Officer or Police Officers of the provisions of this Agreement, and of applicable laws or regulations.
- 6. AWS shall assist Municipality's residents in allowing owned Animals to be claimed during Regular Business Hours. AWS will request proof of payment prior to releasing an Animal to its owner and may collect impoundment fees for the Municipality. AWS reserves the right to release an Animal without proof of payment of impoundment fees if a case warrants the release, in AWS' sole judgment. Impoundment fees collected by the AWS on the Municipality's behalf will be forwarded to the Municipality on a quarterly basis, along with a quarterly report of activity and an invoice for contract fee for service.
- 7. AWS may provide rabies quarantine on a space-available basis for a period of at least ten (10) days to stray dogs and cats found within the Municipality, which have bitten residents of the Municipality ("Rabies Quarantine"). Provision for rabies testing, and the

costs therein, are the sole responsibility of the Municipality and/or its residents. AWS is not obligated to quarantine privately-owned Animals.

- 8. AWS shall provide to Municipality a detailed, quarterly record of the number of stray or lost Animals seized within the territorial limits of Municipality and received by AWS.
- 9. Municipality shall be fully responsible for carrying out all enforcement activities required under the laws of the State of Maine and the ordinances of the Municipality, as may be amended. AWS shall not be required to apprehend or seize any Animal found roaming at large.
- 10. AWS shall make all reasonable efforts to promote Trap, Neuter, Return ("TNR") for feral cats, and return such feral cats that are spayed/neutered, vaccinated, ear tipped and/or micro-chipped to the originating location when possible, and promote caregiver volunteerism and guardianship. The Municipality shall work with AWS and the community to permit and encourage TNR as the preferred method of dealing with feral cats.
- 11. AWS shall have the sole and exclusive right to determine the responsibility of persons offering to become the owners of unclaimed Animals and the suitability of homes offered, and shall have the sole and exclusive right to accept or reject such applicants' claims to previously unclaimed Animals.
- 12. Municipality agrees that it shall notify AWS, in writing, of the identities of all of its duly authorized Animal Control Officers. Municipality agrees that it will provide each Animal Control Officer with a copy of the animal control laws of the State of Maine contained in the booklet published by the Maine Animal Welfare Board, the sections of the Municipality's codes or ordinances, which are pertinent to the performance of their duties, and the terms of this Agreement. Animal Control Officers must also be certified as required by 7 M.R.S. § 3947.
- 13. AWS, its officers, employees, agents and volunteers shall act in an independent capacity during the term of this Agreement and shall not act or hold themselves out as officers, employees, agents or volunteers of Municipality. Municipality, its employees, agents and representatives shall act in an independent capacity during the term of this Agreement and shall not act or hold themselves out as officers, employees, agents or volunteers of AWS. Nothing in this Agreement shall be deemed by either Party or by any third party as creating a joint venture or partnership between AWS and Municipality.
- 14. AWS agrees to comply with applicable federal and state laws and regulations in the performance of this Agreement.
- 15. This Agreement shall not be assigned by either Party, without the prior written approval of the other Party.

- 16. AWS offers to provide the following services to Municipality at no additional cost to Municipality:
 - Disposal Services: AWS will accept for disposal stray or lost cats or dogs, dead on arrival, from Animal Control Officers, or duly authorized Police.
 - b. Telephone Services: To avoid confusion, AWS will take all telephone inquiries regarding reclaiming an Animal and adopting an Animal. Under special circumstances involving suspected abuse or neglect, the Animal Control/Police Officer(s) may request that they be contacted prior to an Animal being reclaimed by its owner.
 - c. Lost and Found Pet Services: AWS staff will take lost and found reports to facilitate the return of pets to their owners.
 - d. Education Services: AWS staff and volunteers will be available for conducting education programs upon request to any interested community group or organization, including schools, grades Kindergarten through 12.
- 17. For services provided by AWS to Municipality under this Agreement or under applicable law, the Municipality agrees to pay AWS the total sum of \$4,828.86, which is based on \$1.39 per capita/per year, of the Municipality's population as of 2010 Census (3,474), payable in advance quarterly payments.

Fee Calculation: 3,474 population x \$1.39 per capita = \$4,828.86

- 18. This Agreement represents the entire agreement between the Parties and no oral or prior written matter shall have any force or effect. No amendment shall be effective without prior express written approval signed by both Parties. Neither Party shall be bound by any conditions not expressly stated in this Agreement.
- 19. This Agreement is binding upon, and shall inure to the benefit of the heirs, assigns and successors in interest of the Parties hereto.
- 20. If any provisions of this Agreement shall be adjudged to be invalid or unenforceable by final judgment of a court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unenforceability shall not affect the validity of the Agreement and the remaining provisions of the Agreement shall be construed as if not containing such provision and, thereafter, the rights and obligation of the parties shall be construed and enforced under the remaining provisions of the Agreement.
- 21. This Agreement shall be governed by, and construed in accordance with, the laws of the State of Maine.
- 22. The fees noted in Paragraph 17, above, shall cover all boarding for Animals delivered to AWS and held other than those pending court proceedings. In the case of

seizures due to cruelty and/or neglect, costs and fees for animal care are the Municipality's responsibility. AWS fee schedules are available upon request.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the parties have caused this Agreement to be duly executed on their behalf, in duplicate counterparts, as of the date first above written.
