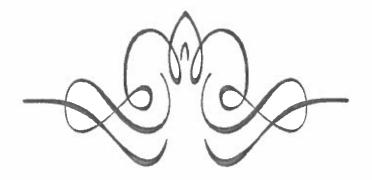

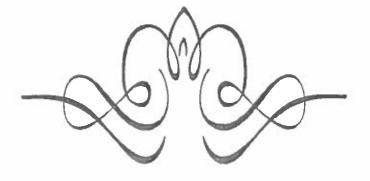

Minutes of the Selectmen's Meeting of August 24, 2017

Selectmen Attending: Patrick A. Briggs, Sheila Matthews-Bull, and Allen Daggett

Selectmen Absent: Stuart Barwise, Edward Hutchins

Others: Michael Claus, Allan Moir, and Arlene McMurray

1. Call to Order.

Chair Briggs called the meeting to order at 9:02 AM.

2. Approve the August 10, 2017, selectmen meeting minutes.

Motion by Selectman Matthews-Bull, seconded by Selectman Daggett, to approve the August 10, 2017, selectmen meeting minutes. **Vote**: 3-0

3. Public Forum (This is an opportunity for anyone who wants to address the Board of Selectmen with any issue that is not on the agenda.)

There were no comments.

4. Authorize the Town Manager to enter into a contract with Foglio, Inc. for the New Biddeford sewer extension.

Wastewater Superintendent Allan Moir and Road Commissioner Michael Claus were present to explain the sewer extension and to answer questions. He said they need 10 longside laterals for a total cost of \$43,000 and 7 shortside laterals for a total cost of \$14,700. Total cost for both is \$57,700, plus the costs of the ledge removal. The rental rate for the escavator with the hammer is \$1,500/day plus \$200 for each hour used.

Motion by Selectman Daggett, seconded by Selectman Matthews-Bull, to authorize the Town Manager to sign the contract with Foglio, Inc. for the New Biddeford sewer extension at a cost of \$57,700 plus the costs of the ledge removal. **Vote**: 3-0.

5. Approve street opening permit for Brian MacDonald at Windemere Place to install underground utilities.

Motion by Selectman Matthews-Bull, seconded by Selectman Daggett, to approve the street opening permit for Brian MacDonald at Windemere Place to install underground utilities. **Vote:** 3-0.

6. Approve street opening permit for Chet Homer for new water service at 83 Ocean Avenue.

Motion by Selectman Daggett, seconded by Selectman Matthews-Bull, to approve the street opening permit for Chet Homer install new water service at 83 Ocean Avenue. **Vote**: 3-0.

7. Sign the supplemental Certificates of Commitment of Sewer User Rates.

Mr. Moir said these supplemental bills are due to a computer error in which this individual did not receive a bill for two years.

Motion by Selectman Daggett, seconded by Selectman Matthews-Bull, to approve the supplemental Certificates of Commitment of Sewer User Rates in the amounts of \$431 for 2016 and \$444 for 2017 plus 7% interest per annum for any unpaid balances beginning September 26, 2017. **Vote:** 3-0.

8. Other business.

Selectman Matthews-Bull said she ran into Kevin Crowley, former principal of Sea Road School and Mildred Day School. He told her the fencing is going up, and they received cost estimates on doing the culvert around Consolidated School which will be done next year.

Selectman Daggett mentioned that he would like to add five more years on his lease at Cape Porpoise Pier for the Cape Pier Chowder House.

Chair Briggs commented that the Chalkfest went well and there was a lot of support from the community.

9. Approve the August 24, 2017, Treasurer's Warrant.

Motion by Selectman Matthews-Bull, seconded by Selectman Daggett to approve the August 24, 2017, Treasurer's Warrant. Vote: 3-0.

10. Adjournment.

Minutes of the Selectmen's Meeting of September 7, 2017

1. Call to Order.

Chair Briggs called the meeting to order at 6:55 PM.

2. Approve the August 24, 2017, selectmen meeting minutes.

The Board will address this item at the next meeting when there is a quorum present that attended this meeting.

3. Public Forum (This is an opportunity for anyone who wants to address the Board of Selectmen with any issue that is not on the agenda.)

There were no comments.

4. Sign the November 2017 Special Town Meeting Warrant.

Town Clerk Tracey O'Roak explained the three items on the November ballot:

- Question 1: Enactment Ordinance Prohibiting Retail Marijuana Establishments and Retail Marijuana Social Clubs in the Town of Kennebunkport.
- Question 2: Amendment to Land Use Ordinance Regarding Accessary Apartments.
- Question 3: Amendment to the Waterfront Ordinance.

Motion by Selectman Hutchins, seconded by Selectman Daggett, to approve the November 7, 2017, Special Town Meeting Warrant. **Vote**: 4-0.

5. Approve Certification of Proposed Ordinances.

Motion by Selectman Hutchins, seconded by Selectman Barwise, to approve the Certification of Proposed Ordinances. **Vote**: 4-0.

6. Set the public hearing date for either October 12, or 26, 2017, to consider the Warrant Articles for the November 7, 2017, Special Town Meeting ballot.

Motion by Selectman Hutchins, seconded by Selectman Barwise, to set the public hearing date for October 12 to consider the Warrant Articles for the November 7, 2017, Special Town Meeting. **Vote**: 4-0.

7. Consider reinstatement of the Boston Post Cane.

Town Clerk Tracey O'Roak explained the Boston Post tradition since 1909 to present a special cane to the town's oldest resident. The criteria for this award is that the resident must be 90 years or older and have resided in Kennebunkport for at least the past 20 years. She will place a notice in the local newspaper and contact the Kennebunkport Historical Society to advertise her search for the eldest citizen. A three-person committee would decide who to nominate. She will have nomination papers at town hall and online. If the person nominated does not wish to receive the cane, the award goes to the next nomination in line. The cane that was given in Kennebunkport was lost, but there is vendor in New Hampshire can create a replica of it.

Selectman Briggs suggested announcing on the Town Website that the Town is searching for the lost cane.

Motion by Selectman Daggett, seconded by Selectman Barwise, to reinstate the Boston Post Cane and to authorize the guidelines presented and give the Town Manager the authority to take not more than \$1,000 from the contingency fund to purchase the cane. **Vote**: 4-0.

8. Approve the Agreement for Public Safety Answering Point Service with the Town of York.

Ms. Smith explained that the Town of York will continue to answer the 911 calls, and if the call is regarding a fire or emergency medical issue, the York PD will stay on the line with the caller and the Kennebunkport dispatch will route the calls to the services needed. She said town counsel has reviewed the contract which will be effective from September 1, 2017, to August 31, 2020.

Motion by Selectman Hutchins, seconded by Selectman Barwise, to approve the Agreement for Public Safety Answering Point Service with the Town of York. **Vote**: 4-0.

9. Meet as Assessors to approve the following abatement.

A property survey showed a reduction in parcel size by 1.4 acres. This reduction decreases the land value by \$20,400. As a result, Assessors Agent Rebecca Nolette recommended a tax abatement of \$178.10.

Motion by Selectman Hutchins, seconded by Selectman Barwise, to approve the tax abatement of \$178.10 as recommended by Assessors Agent Rebecca Nolette to Robert and Dana Holland, 155 Wildes District Road, map 22, block 5, lot 22. **Vote**: 4-0.

10. Approve street opening permit for Binnacle Hill Development, LLC, for installation of new sewer line and services and new waterline on New Biddeford Road.

Motion by Selectman Hutchins, seconded by Selectman Barwise, to approve the street opening permit for Binnacle Hill Development, LLC, for installation of new sewer line and services and new waterline on New Biddeford Road. **Vote**: 4-0.

11. Discuss Cape Porpoise Pier Chowder House lease.

Ms. Smith announced that the lease is up this November. The current tenant would like another 5-year extension. She asked if the Board wanted to send out request for proposals or to work out a new lease with the current tenant.

The Board agreed to send out a notification to the public to see if someone from the public would like it to be a formal process. If there is no response by September 25, it will continue with the process at the next meeting.

12. Other business.

Ms. Smith announced that everyone received their tax bill which also included a newsletter and senior survey. They hope everyone will fill out the survey and respond. There are extra surveys at town hall and online.

13. Approve the September 7, 2017, Treasurer's Warrant.

Motion by Selectman Hutchins, seconded by Selectman Daggett, to approve the September 7, 2017, Treasurer's Warrant. **Vote**: 4-0.

14. Adjournment.

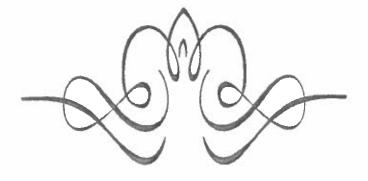

Enclosed please find the following items:

- MMA's new (October 1, 2017-September 30, 2018) "General Assistance Ordinance Appendix" (A - D).
- "GA Maximums Summary Sheet" which consolidates GA maximums into one document. Municipalities do have to insert individual locality maximums from Appendix A and C in the summary sheet where indicated in order to complete the information. The "summary" does not have to be adopted, as it is not an Appendix but a tool for municipal officials administering GA.
- "GA Maximums Adoption Form" which was developed so that municipalities may easily send DHHS proof of GA maximums adoption. Once the selectpersons or council adopts the new maximums, the enclosed form should be signed and submitted to DHHS. (see "Filing of GA Ordinance and/or Appendices" below for further information).

Appendix A - D

The enclosed Appendices A - D have been revised for your municipality's General Assistance Ordinance. These new Appendices, <u>once adopted</u>, should replace the existing Appendices A - D. Even if you have already adopted MMA's model General Assistance Ordinance, <u>the municipal officers must approve/adopt the new Appendices yearly.</u>

The Adoption Process

The municipal officers (i.e., selectpersons/council) adopt the local General Assistance Ordinance and yearly Appendices, even in town meeting communities. The law requires that the municipal officers adopt the ordinance and/or Appendices <u>after notice and hearing</u>. Seven days posted notice is recommended, unless local law (or practice) provides otherwise.

At the hearing, the municipal officers should:

- 1) Allow all interested members of the public an opportunity to comment on the proposed ordinance;
- 2) End public discussion, close the hearing; and
- 3) Move and vote to adopt the ordinance either in its posted form or as amended in light of public discussion.

Filing of GA Ordinance and/or Appendices

Please remember that General Assistance law requires each municipality to send DHHS a copy of its ordinance once adopted. (For a copy of the GA model ordinance, please call MMA's Publication Department, or visit their web site www.memun.org). In addition, any changes or amendments, such as new Appendices, must also be submitted to DHHS. DHHS will accept the enclosed "adoption sheet" as proof that a municipality has adopted the current GA maximums.

It was recently discovered that you recently acquired the property located at 5 Fox Run, further identified as Map 8, Block 3, Lot 1H., in January 12,2017. Winter sand bids were received by the Town and are as follows for delivery to the Highway Garage at 105 Beachwood Ave or pick up by Kennebunkport Public Works:

Dayton Sand and Gravel: Sand – \$9.00 per CY, Delivered; \$5.00 per CY Picked Up

RH Brown / Hissong Development Stone Dust - \$9.10 per CY, Delivered; \$4.20 per CY Picked Up

Both bid materials are acceptable performing winter abrasives. Stone dust and sand have different densities, so by weight we get 8% more stone dust in a cubic yard as compared to sand.

All bidders appear to meet our winter sand specifications. Both pick up locations have approximately the same round trip delivery time. 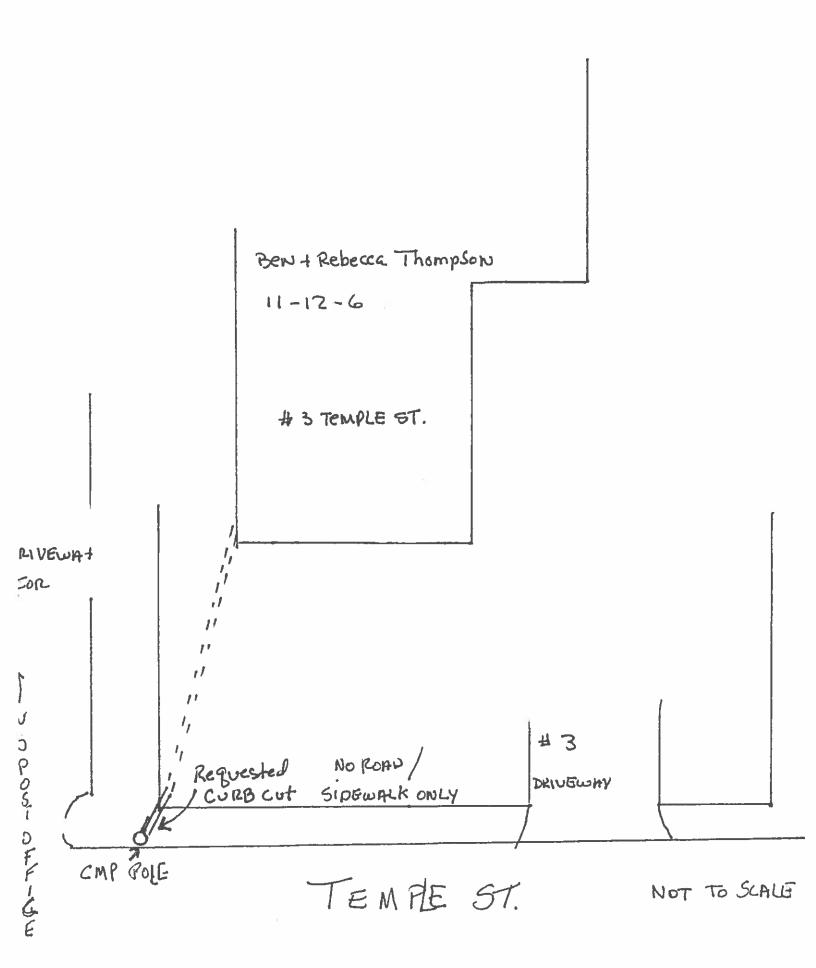

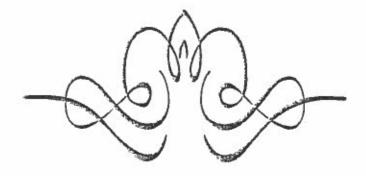

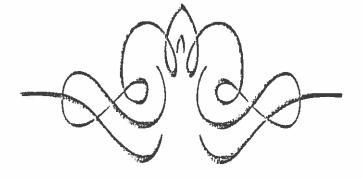

This matter came before the Court on the Plaintiff's Complaint for relief under Rule 80K of the Maine Rules of Civil Procedure. By the consent of the parties it is hereby ordered and adjudged that the Defendant has committed a violation of the Kennebunkport Land Use Ordinance ("Ordinance" or "LUO") by reason of a violation of the Town's setback requirements applicable to "corner lot" properties located in the Goose Rocks Zone, on Defendant's property located at 9 Community House Road, Kennebunkport, Maine (Tax Map 35, Block 18, Lot 5). The parties in the above-captioned matter hereby STIPULATE AND AGREE to the entry of Judgment as follows:

- Defendant LINDA B. PICHETTE is the owner of a certain residential property located at 9 Community House Road, Kennebunkport, Maine, identified on Kennebunkport Assessor's Map as Tax Map 35, Block 18, Lot 5, the property being further described in a deed from Mark A. Taylor and Bernice S. Taylor dated September 20, 1985, and recorded in the York County Registry of Deeds in Book 3641, Page 175. The property, comprised of a residential corner lot with frontage along Community House Road and along a private right of way, is hereinafter referred to as "the subject property". The subject property is located in the Goose Rocks Zone.
- 2. This matter has been filed pursuant to the provisions of 30-A M.R.S. §
 4452 and M.R.Civ.P. Rule 80K for enforcement of land use laws and
 ordinances upon the discovery of an apparent non-conformity in the
 location of the addition as constructed on the subject property in 1998.
- 3. Both parties consent to the filing of the Complaint in this matter pursuant to Title 30-A M.R.S. §4452 and M.R.Civ.P. Rule 80K and waive any requirements of service of process, formal citation, and any other jurisdictional issues; it is the intent of the parties to fully vest this Court with jurisdiction over the matters contained herein.

- 4. The subject property is a "corner lot" and has two front lot lines, as those terms are defined in LUO Article 2, Section 2.2. A "corner lot" is defined in the LUO as a lot with at least two (2) contiguous sides abutting a street or right of way. The definition of "front lot line," as applied to a corner lot, is the line separating the lot from <u>each</u> street or right of way.
- 5. The subject property contains two front lot lines, one along Community
 House Way, a public way, and the other along a private right of way.
 Therefore, Section 4.8 of the LUO requires a 20 foot setback from these two front lot lines on the subject property.
- 6. In 1984, the Zoning Board of Appeals granted approval to Defendant's predecessor in title of a functional division of property, leading to the creation of the corner lot that became the subject property. See Exhibit A.

 The plot plan associated with this approval shows the subject property with 76 feet of road frontage on Old Proctor Road (which is now known as Community House Road). It is unclear whether any field measurements were taken to support the road frontage dimensions drawn on the plot plan.
- 7. On October 5, 1998, Defendant, through her builder, Lawrence D. Inglis, obtained a building permit to add an addition to the residence on the subject property. The project description was as follows: "Add 14 x 24

garage to west side of the house with two bedrooms over. Extend house in rear over current deck area in rear. Eliminate front bedroom first floor for stairway to second floor". A copy of the building permit issued is attached hereto as Exhibit B. The drawings attached to the 1998 building permit show the existing residence to be located 20 feet from the edge of Community House Road, and 34 feet from the edge of the private right of way; the proposal was to add a 14′ x 24′ garage along the northwesterly side of the residence, which would bring the renovated residence to within 20 feet of the private right of way. Both the front and side setbacks are listed on the 1998 building permit as being 20 feet. Upon information and belief, at or near the time the garage was constructed in 1998, an inspection was performed by the Plaintiff's then representative to determine compliance with the building permit.

8. A mortgage inspection plan performed by Livingston-Hughes on November 22, 2016, a copy of the same which is attached as Exhibit C, disclosed the setback from the private way to be only fifteen (15) feet, which is therefore in violation of the applicable 20-foot setback requirement under the current LUO as well as the LUO in effect at the time the building permit for the addition was issued. At the time the garage was constructed in 1998, it was not apparent to Defendant or

Defendant's builder that the garage encroached upon the applicable 20-foot setback requirement. The Defendant believes that the builder based the 14' x 24' garage addition on the 1984 plot plan which shows the road frontage along Old Proctor Road (now Community House Road) to be 76 feet. The 2016 mortgage inspection plan, however, shows the road frontage to be 71 feet (which would appear to account for the 5-foot encroachment).

- 9. During the entire period of Defendant's ownership of the subject property up until the 2016 mortgage inspection plan was done, Defendant has used the subject property without knowledge of the non-conformity.
- 10. The Plaintiff Town has investigated and finds that the afore-mentioned setback violation was inadvertent, and was not the result of a willful, premeditated act of bad faith or of gross negligence on the part of the Defendant, a predecessor in title to the Defendant, or an agent of either one of them. The Town further finds that the violation does not pose any significant health, safety or welfare problem and it would not serve the public interest to require the garage addition to be relocated or removed for purposes of eliminating the setback violation because the impacts of allowing the mislocated structure to remain in its existing location will not

- be substantially different from or greater than the impact and effects of a structure which conforms to the applicable setback requirements.
- 11. This Stipulated Judgment does not authorize any expansion, enlargement, alteration or relocation of the residence (as enlarged) on the subject property that does not comply with applicable setback provisions of the Ordinance. It is the intent of this Stipulated Judgment that the portions of the existing structure that violate the setback provisions of the Ordinance may be repaired in their current location, but shall not otherwise be enlarged, altered or relocated without conforming to existing Ordinance provisions.
- 12. Plaintiff agrees, and hereby does relinquish, its right to any further prosecution of the Defendant, the Defendant's successors and assigns, for the aforesaid setback violation of the Kennebunkport Land Use Ordinance; provided, however, that if the Defendant, or the Defendant's successors or assigns, shall breach or otherwise fail to meet the terms of this Stipulated Judgment, Plaintiff may institute appropriate Court proceedings to enforce the provisions of the Kennebunkport Land Use Ordinance and/or this Stipulated Judgment, and shall be entitled to applicable remedies, as well as injunctive relief.

13.	The Defendant agrees to pay the Plaintiff a civil penalty in the amount of
	\$, as well as the reasonable attorneys' fees incurred by the
	Plaintiff in connection with resolution of this matter (which are estimated
	to be no more than \$1,000.00). Said payment shall be made to the Plaintiff
	Town within thirty (30) days of entry of this Stipulated Judgment.

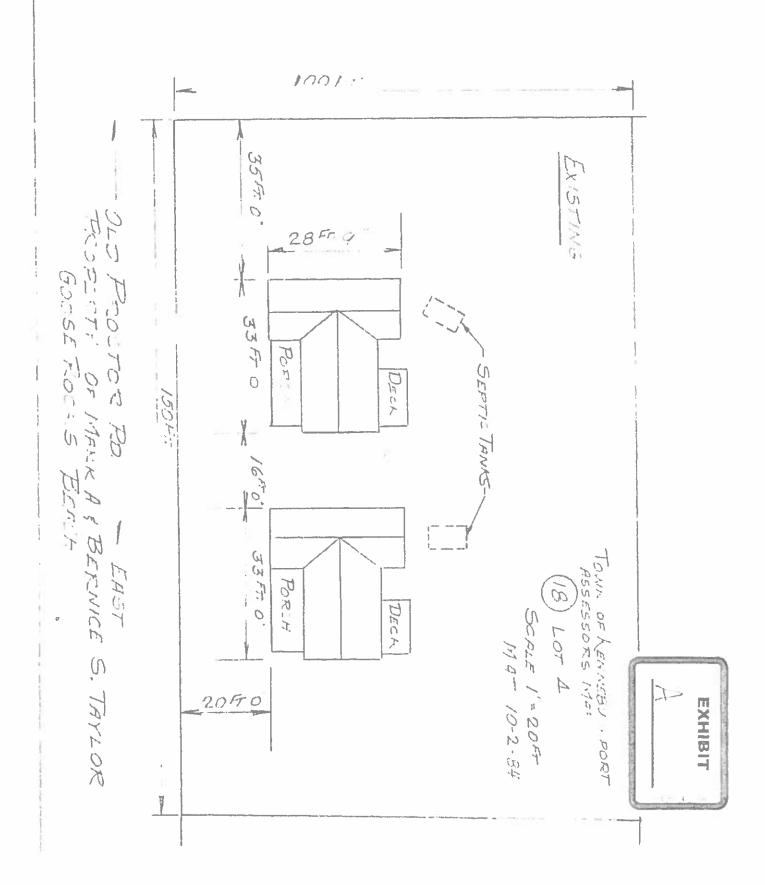

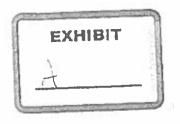

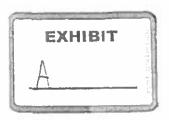

The Kennebunkport Zoning Board of Appeals conducted a public hearing on November 5, 1984, at 7:30 p.m., on the appeal for a variance to divide a lot to permit sale of separate cottages thereon which does not meet lot coverage and frontage requirements.

Findings of Fact

- 1. The appellants, Mark and Bernice Taylor are the owners of Lot 4, Block 18, Map 35, situated along Old Proctor Road in the town of Kennebunkport.
- 2. The property is in the Goose Rocks Zone and the Shoreland Zone .
- 3. The property consists of a single undersized lot of 16,000 sq. ft. with two single family dwellings on it. The dwellings have separate septic systems and separate water and electric systems.
- 4. The appellants wish to divide the lot and create two undersized lots, each with a single family dwelling on it.
- 5. The appellants request for a permit was denied under Sec. 7D1 of the ordinance which states, "The minimum size for any use permitted in this zone shall be 20,000 square feet, and the minimum frontage of any lot upon the major access route to it shall be at least 100 feet."



- 6. The appellants purchased this property in 1967.
- 7. It is a lot of record and the buildings predate zoning.
- 8. Testimony from the appellants showed that the dwellings have been utilized as separate summer rentals prior to and since 1972, the effective date of the ordinance.
- 9. Mrs. Smith, an abuttor, and former owner gave testimony that the land was acquired by her as two separate lots and she conveyed them to the Taylors as a single lot.
- 10. All appropriate abuttors were notified and notice of the hearing was advertized in the October 24, 1984 issue of the Y.C.C.S.

Judgment

It is the judgment of the Zoning Board of Appeals that in accordance with the decision of the Supreme Judicial Court of Maine, in the Keith vs. Saco River Corridor Commission the appellants' property was functionally divided on the effective date of the ordinance and therefore may be conveyed as two separate lots.

NOW COMES the Plaintiff, the Town of Kennebunkport and makes the following complaint against the Defendant, Linda B. Pichette, pursuant to Rule 80K of the Maine Rules of Civil Procedure:

1. LOCATION OF VIOLATION:

9 Community House Road Kennebunkport, Maine

IA. NAME AND ADDRESSES OF DEFENDANT:

Linda B. Pichette c/o Daniel T. Rush, Esq. 124 Fletcher Street Kennebunk, ME 04043

1B. RECORD OWNER:

Linda B. Pichette by virtue of a deed from Mark A. Taylor and Bernice S. Taylor dated September 20, 1985, and recorded in the York County Registry of Deeds in Book 3641, Page 175.

2. **HISTORY OF VIOLATION:**

On October 5, 1998, Defendant, through her builder, Lawrence D. Inglis, obtained a building permit to add an addition to her house at 9 Community House Road in Kennebunkport, Maine. The project description was as follows: "Add 14 x 24 garage to west side of the house with two bedrooms over. Extend house in rear over current deck area in rear. Eliminate front bedroom first floor for stairway to second floor". A copy of the building permit issued is attached hereto as Exhibit "A".

3. DESCRIPTION OF VIOLATION/SUMMARY OF LAW VIOLATED:

Violation of Article 4, Section 4.8-Zone Regulations of the Kennebunkport Zoning Ordinance. The Pichette property is a "Corner Lot" as defined in Article 2-Construction of Language and Definitions, which is defined as a lot with at least two (2) contiguous sides abutting a street or right of way. The definition of Front Lot Line, on a corner lot, is the line separating the lot from each street or right of way. In this case, the front line of the property is the sideline of Community House Way, a public way, and the left line is a private right of way. Because of this definition, the side line of Community House Road, and the side line of the private right of way to the left are both considered "Front Lot Lines". Therefore, section 4.8 of the ordinance requires a 20 foot setback. The mortgage inspection plan done by Livingston-Hughes on November 22, 2016, a copy of the same which is attached as Exhibit "B", disclosed the setback from the private way to be only fifteen (15) feet, which is therefore in violation of the setback requirement.

4. PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION:

Penalties are as governed by 30-A M.R.S.A. §4452.

Street re-numbering

In 1988, Maine voters approved the statewide deployment of Enhanced 911 service, or E911. The benefit of having an E911 system was for residents to be able to dial 9-1-1 to reach emergency services, along with having their address/location displayed on screen. In the Spring of 1989, the then four fire chiefs petitioned the Board of Selectmen, requesting permission to be the agency to facilitate the assigning of the numbers, naming of unnamed rights of way, removing duplicate names and re-naming streets which sounded similar to other streets. The changes began in 1990.

The Addressing Officials consulted with Code Enforcement, regarding zoning regulations, unbuildable status' of lots, etc. At that time, based on the information given, the Addressing Officials moved forward with the numbering of homes in a way that seemed efficient at that time. There had been little guidance from the State of Maine as this was a new concept for all municipalities. It wasn't until 1997 the State of Maine issued its first Addressing Officer Manual. That manual was received here in Kennebunkport 3 years after the final street numbers and street names had been issued to individual property owners. The manual prohibited some of the practices that the fire chiefs had adopted, and due to the scale of the project and the impact on residents, the fire chiefs decided not to start the numbering process anew again. A stipulation within the addressing manual, was for individual towns to adopt of a model street naming and numbering guide, our current Street Naming and Numbering Ordinance was adopted in January 1997.

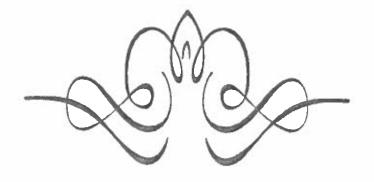
Due to unforeseen development and lot changes the town began using "rear" or alpha designates a practice not permitted in the Addressing Officer Manual. Other issues that have evolved include inconsistences in numbering sequencing, reclocation of driveways to side streets, and the development of a variety of condominium structures. A review of existing errors in street numbering indicates that several streets need to be entirely or in part re-addressed.

Kings Highway is an example of many of these challenges and the Public Safety Committee did a physical review of Kings Highway and initially decided to fix the known problems with the goal to have as little impact as few as people as possible. Unfortunately, the original changes proposed, do not factor in any potential future development and would require the recycling of numbers.

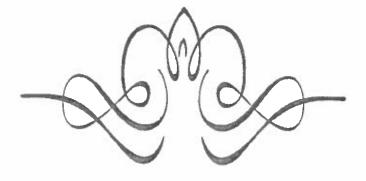
The Public Safety Committee ultimately voted to request support of the Board of Selectmen to review all streets in town and correct all known problems, either by re-numbering and/or potentially renaming streets to be in compliance with State of Maine E911 guidelines.

We understand the personal impact this action will have on many residents; however, our goal is the efficient and effective response of public safety personnel in an emergency.

Our Public Safety Committee is also reviewing our current Street Ordinance and will have recommendations for amendments at the next annual town meeting.

LEASE AGREEMENT

This Lease made and entered this day of November, 2007 by and between the Inhabitants of the Town of Kennebunkport, a Maine municipality (hereinafter referred to as "Landlord"), and Cape Porpoise Lobster Co. (hereinafter referred to as "Tenant").

ARTICLE I

Premises

Landlord hereby leases, demises and lets unto Tenant and Tenant hereby leases, takes and hires from Landlord, for the term and upon and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in this Lease Agreement (hereinafter the "Lease"), the building operated most recently as the "Cape Pier Chowder House", together with the outside deck area and as shown on Appendix A hereto and made a part hereof (hereinafter the "Premises" or the "Leased Premises"), which Premises are, at the commencement of this lease, only a portion of the Landlord's property located at or near Cape Porpoise Pier in the Town of Kennebunkport, Maine. The Premises shall include a right of reasonable access thereto.

ARTICLE II Term

The term of this Lease shall begin on December 1, 2007, and end on November 30, 2012. Landlord may offer Tenant the option to extend the lease for an additional five year period at mutually agreeable terms. Tenant shall have no right to extend the term of this Lease unilaterally.

ARTICLE III Rent

Section 3.01. <u>Base Rent</u>. During each Lease Year during the term of this Lease, Tenant shall promptly pay Landlord, without any offset, abatement, deductions or setoff whatsoever and without previous demand therefor, at the address set forth in this Lease in regard to notices or at such other place as Landlord may direct by notice in writing to Tenant from time to time, the annual Base Rent for the each Lease Year at the rates set forth hereinafter, which Base Rent shall be payable, in advance, in five (5) equal installments on April 1st, June 1st, July 1st, July 15th and August 1st of each and every Lease Year during said term. "Lease Year" means the successive periods during the term set forth below, even if such period is not a full 12 months, with the first such period to begin on April 1, 2008.

The Lease Year Base Rent shall be as follows:

- 1. For the Lease Year April 1, 2008, through December 31, 2008, \$40,000.00
- 2. For the Lease Year January 1, 2009 through December 31, 2009, \$ 40,000.00
- 3. For the Lease Year January 1, 2010 through December 31, 2010, \$ 40,000.00
- 4. For the Lease Year January 1, 2011 through December 31, 2011, \$ 40,000.00
- 5. For the Lease Year January 1, 2012 through November 30, 2012, \$ 40,000.00

ARTICLE IV Landlord's Obligations

Section 4.01. Quiet Enjoyment. Landlord warrants that, so long as Tenant faithfully performs all agreements and obligations of this Lease, Tenant shall, subject to applicable provisions of law and governmental authorities and to Landlord's rights hereunder, including the right to alter, improve, maintain, repair, or replace any portions of the Premises or any fixtures, appurtenances and equipment thereof, peaceably and quietly have, hold, and enjoy the Premises for the term set forth herein without molestation or disturbance by and from Landlord and free from any and all encumbrances except as otherwise specified in this Lease.

Section 4.02. <u>Improvements</u>. Tenant agrees and accepts the Premises "As Is" "Where Is" in their current condition.

Section 4.03. Maintenance and Repairs. Throughout the term of this lease, Landlord shall be responsible for maintaining the proper condition and functioning, and to maintain in good order and repair, the pier supports on which the Premises are located; provided, however, that if these supports prove inadequate to enable Tenant to use the Leased Premises or otherwise create an unsafe condition, then Landlord may, at its option, either (i) repair the supports to the Tenant's reasonable satisfaction, or (ii) terminate this Lease without further liability to Landlord. Tenant shall be entitled to an abatement of rent during any period of repair or maintenance performed by Landlord which renders the Leased Premises unusable by Tenant.

ARTICLE V Tenant's Obligations

Section 5.01. <u>Payment of Rent</u>. Tenant shall pay each and every installment of Base Rent and other amounts due hereunder promptly when due, and without demand by Landlord and without any withholding or offset whatsoever.

Section 5.02. <u>Utility Charges</u>. Tenant shall pay when due all utility charges for sewer, water, gas, telephone and electrical service, and any other utilities used or consumed on the Premises.

Section 5.03. <u>Personal Property Taxes</u>. Tenant shall pay all personal property taxes levied or assessed in respect of all personal property and trade fixtures situated on such Premises, excluding any personal property owned by Landlord.

Section 5.04. <u>Use and Occupancy</u>. Tenant shall use and occupy the Premises solely for a restaurant, including "take-out" food, in accordance with the provisions of Appendix B hereto, and in all cases for purposes which are lawfully permitted under applicable laws and for which the Premises are reasonably suited and for no other purposes whatsoever. Notwithstanding the terms of the Lease, the Premises shall be used and operated for their permitted purposes only between the dates of April 1st and November 30th of each Lease Year. Tenant shall obtain any and all licenses or permits necessary for the conduct of its permitted use of the Premises and shall comply, at its expense, with all governmental laws, rules, regulations and ordinances, and with all of Landlord's insurance policies applicable to the Leased Premises and with all

reasonable rules and regulations established by Landlord from time to time; and, without limiting the forgoing, Tenant shall comply with the Rules and Regulations as set forth in Exhibit B and the Cape Porpoise Pier Ordinance set forth in Appendix C both of which exhibits are attached hereto and are hereby incorporated as part of this Lease. To the extent the provisions of the body of this Lease and Appendices B and/or C may conflict, the most restrictive of the three shall control.

Section 5.05. Maintenance and Repairs. Tenant shall maintain the Premises, including a restroom facility that will be open to the public during operating hours, in as good order, repair, and condition as the Premises existed at the commencement of this Lease, reasonable wear and tear excepted. Except as provided in Section 4.03 above, Tenant shall be solely responsible for all repairs and replacements to the entire Premises belonging to Landlord, whether or not then being used or occupied by Tenant, during the entire lease term. Without limiting the forgoing, Tenant shall be responsible for and shall pay, either to Landlord or to parties doing such work, the following: all maintenance to the roof of the Premises, the exterior walls and structural portions of the Premises, and the utility lines and services, water, sewer and sprinkler charges painting, decorating, door and window repair and replacement, paving, insurance costs, service contracts on HVAC units, and all other usual and customary expenses of owning, operating and preserving the Premises.

Section 5.06 Alterations. Tenant shall not make any alterations, installations repairs, improvements, replacements or additions in, to or about any part of the Premises, or remodel all or any part of the Premises, without the prior written consent of Landlord, including the prior written approval by Landlord of the plans and specifications therefor, which consent or approval will not be unreasonably withheld nor delayed. Tenant shall remove at its own expense any alterations, additions, and the like installed in violation of this provision. In the event of failure of Tenant to so remove, Landlord shall have the right to enter and remove such alternation, additions and the like, and charge the reasonable cost thereof to Tenant. All additions, repairs, replacements, alternations and improvements to the premises made by Tenant, including all materials used and incorporated therein, shall become the property of Landlord upon the expiration or termination of this Lease.

Section 5.07. Signage. Tenant shall not install advertisements of any kind including, but not limited to, signs, awnings and signals, to any part of the leased Premises including the inside or outside of the windows or doors unless and until the style, size, color, construction, and location of such advertisements have been approved in writing by Landlord. Tenant agrees that upon expiration or termination of this Lease Agreement, Tenant will remove such advertisements and restore the affected portion of the leased premises to its original condition prior to the installation of such advertisements.

Section 5.08. <u>Security and Safety Regulations</u>. Tenant shall conform to all reasonable rules and procedures now or hereafter established by Landlord for the safe, secure and orderly use of the Premises.

Section 5.09. <u>Landlord Entry for Repairs</u>. Notwithstanding the respective obligations of the parties, and without creating or implying any obligation on the part of the Landlord, Tenant shall permit Landlord at any time to enter the Premises to install, maintain, repair, and replace any pipes, ducts, meters, wires and other machinery, equipment, apparatus, and fixtures if, in the

judgment of the Landlord, such improvements are necessary and consistent with sound real estate management of similar buildings. Such work shall be carried out in a manner to cause the Tenant minimum inconvenience.

Section 5.10. <u>Waste and Nuisances</u>. Tenant shall not injure or deface the Premises. Tenant shall not permit the use of the Premises for any purposes other than those provided herein and shall not permit any use of the Premises which is improper, offensive, or contrary to law or ordinance. Tenant shall not permit on the Premises any hazardous or inflammable substances, fluids, or chemicals and shall permit no objectionable noise, odors or other nuisance. Tenant shall not permit or maintain any conditions which might cause an adverse effect on any insurance coverage affecting the Premises.

Section 5.11. <u>Risk of Loss</u>. Tenant shall hold the property owned by Tenant, or in the Tenant's custody situated on the Premises, at Tenant's own risk.

Section 5.12. <u>Liability and Casualty Insurance</u>. Tenant shall insure Tenant and Landlord, as their interests may appear, with comprehensive general liability and all-risk property and casualty insurance coverage on the Premises in such amount and with such companies as Landlord shall reasonably require, but in no event for less than One Million Dollars for injury or death in any single accident, which coverage shall provide for thirty (30) days prior notice of cancellation, nonrenewal or expiration. Tenant shall provide evidence of such insurance coverage on request. In no event shall the limits of such policies be considered to limit Tenant's liability under this Lease.

By way of amplification of, and not in limitation of, the provisions of this Section 5.12, at all times after the execution of this Lease, Tenant will take out and keep in force, at its expense:

- a. Comprehensive general liability insurance, naming Landlord and its officers, agents and employees as additional insureds, including insurance against assumed or contractual liability, with respect to the Premises, insuring against damage to property and bodily injury, including death caused by any act or omission, including the furnishing or consumption of alcohol by Tenant, its employees, contractors or licensees, patrons and invitees. Such insurance shall afford protection to the limits of not less than Three Million Dollars (\$3,000,000.00) per occurrence/aggregate with respect to bodily injury or death. Said insurance shall provide for coverage of other occupants or users of Landlord's Premises who might be harmed or injured, or suffer property damage, as a result of any activities caused by or occurring on the Premises.
- b. All-risk casualty insurance, written at replacement cost value and with replacement cost endorsement, covering all of the Premises and all of Tenant's personal property in the Premises (including, without limitation, inventory, trade fixtures, floor coverings, furniture and other property removable by Tenant under the provisions of this Lease), and all leasehold improvements installed in the Premises by Tenant.
- c. Prior to execution of this Lease, upon request at each annual anniversary of this Lease, and at any other time reasonably requested by Landlord, Tenant shall provide certificates of insurance evidencing Tenant's compliance with the above provisions and naming Landlord as an additional insured. The company or companies writing any insurance which Tenant is required to take out and

maintain or cause to be taken out or maintained pursuant hereto, as well as the form of the insurance coverage, shall at all time be subject to Landlord's approval, and any such company or companies shall be licensed to do business in the State of Maine.

d. Tenant will not do or suffer to be done, or keep or suffer to be kept, anything in, upon or about the Premises which will contravene Landlord's policies of hazard or liability insurance or which will prevent Landlord from procuring such policies in companies acceptable to Landlord. If anything done, omitted to be done or suffered by Tenant to be kept in, upon or about the Premises shall cause the rate of fire or other insurance on the Premises or on other property of Landlord to be increased beyond the minimum rate from time to time applicable to the Premises or to any such property for the use or uses made thereof, Tenant will pay as additional rental, the amount of any such increase upon Landlord's demand.

Section 5.13. <u>Indemnity</u>. Tenant shall hold harmless, defend and indemnify Landlord from any injury, death, loss, claim, or damage to any person or property while on or about the Premises and from any injury, loss, claim, or damage to any persons or property anywhere occasioned by any act, neglect, omission, or default of Tenant or its employees, agents, visitors, invitees or contractors.

Section 5.14. Waiver of Subrogation. Landlord and Tenant each hereby release the other from any and all liability or responsibility to the other, or to anyone claiming through or under them by way of subrogation or otherwise, for any loss or damage caused by fire or any of the extended coverage or supplementary contract casualties, provided, however, that this release shall be applicable and in effect only with respect to loss or damage occurring during any time as any applicable party's insurance policies shall contain a clause or endorsement to the effect that such release shall not adversely affect or impair said policies or prejudice the rights of the insured thereunder and provided further that this release shall apply only to the extent that insurance proceeds are actually received or collected under the insurance policy of the party sustaining the loss. Each party agrees that its policies will include such a clause or endorsement if obtainable without extra cost or if extra cost is charged, then as long as the other party pays such extra costs after notice thereof.

Section 5.15. <u>Liens and Encumbrances</u>. Tenant shall not suffer or permit any lien or encumbrance of any nature or description to be placed against the Premises or any portion thereof. Tenant shall have no authority to permit any lien or encumbrance to attach to or be placed upon Landlord's title or interest to the premises, building, or any portion thereof

Section 5.16. <u>Landlord Entry for Inspection and Show</u>. Tenant shall permit Landlord or its agents to enter upon the Premises at reasonable times to inspect the premises. Tenant shall permit Landlord to show the Premises throughout the term of this Lease.

Section 5.17. <u>Surrender</u>. At the expiration or termination of this Lease, Tenant shall peaceably surrender the Premises and all additions, alterations, and improvements to Landlord, broom clean and in good order, repair, and condition. At the expiration or termination of this Lease, Tenant shall further remove all goods and effects not attached to the Premises, repair all damage caused by such removal and leave the Premises in clean and tenantable condition.

Section 5.18. Environmental. Tenant represents, warrants and agrees that its use, maintenance and operation of the Premises and the conduct of the business related thereto, shall at all times be in compliance with all applicable federal, state, county or local laws, regulations and ordinances of any governmental authorities relating to Hazardous Materials, as hereinafter defined, and that Tenant, its agents, employees, customers, suppliers and invitees will not cause any Hazardous Materials to be deposited, discharged, placed or disposed of at the Premises and that the premises will remain free from Hazardous Materials.

Tenant shall, to the extent arising from breach of the foregoing warranty, (a) conduct and complete all investigations, studies, sampling and testing, and all remedial, removal and other actions necessary to clean up, and remove all Hazardous Materials from the Premises, in accordance with all applicable federal, state and local laws, regulations, rules, ordinances and policies and in accordance with the orders and directives of all federal, state and local governmental authorizes, and (b) defend, indemnify and hold harmless Landlord, its employees, agents, officers and directors, from and against any and all claims, demands, penalties, fines, liabilities, settlements, damages, costs or expenses (including, without limit, attorney and consultant fees, investigation and laboratory fees, court costs and litigation expenses) of whatever kind or nature, known or unknown, contingent or otherwise, arising out of or in any relation to (i) the discovery, presence, disposal, release, or threatened release, of any Hazardous Materials hereafter placed within, under, upon, from or into the Premises, (ii) any personal injury (including wrongful death) or property damage (real or personal), any lawsuit brought or threatened, settlement reached, or government order and/or any violations of laws, orders, regulations, requirements, or demands of government authorities, now in effect or at any time in the future, which are based upon or in any way related to any Hazardous Materials hereafter placed on the Premises.

As used herein, "Hazardous Materials" shall mean any flammable explosives, radioactive materials, hazardous materials, hazardous waste, hazardous or toxic substances or matter, oil or other petroleum products, underground petroleum storage tanks, asbestos, chemical pollutants or related materials, including as defined in the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation and Liability Act of 1980, as amended (42 U.S.C. §§9601, et seq.), the Hazardous Materials Transportation Act, as amended (49 U.S.C. §§1801, et seq.), the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act, as amended (42 U.S.C. §§6901, et seq.), applicable Maine Statutes (including 38 M.R.S.A. §561, et seq.; 39 M.R.S.A. §§1361, et seq.; 38 M.R.S.A. §§1301, et seq.; and 38 M.R.S.A. §§1317, et seq.) or any similar federal, state or local law in effect from time to time, or in the regulations adopted and publications promulgated pursuant thereto or any other substances or materials constituting a hazard, peril or threat to the health of persons, animals or plant life.

Section 5.19. Security Deposit. Tenant has previously paid Landlord a security deposit in the amount of One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500), and paid by response to a request for proposals issued by Landlord the amount of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000) as security for the full and faithful performance by Tenant of each and every term, provision, covenant and condition of this Lease. If Tenant defaults in respect to any of the terms, provisions, covenants and conditions of this Lease, including but not limited to payment of rent, Landlord may, but shall not be required

to, use, apply or retain the whole or any part of the security for the payment of any rent in default or for any other sum which Landlord may expend or be required to expend by reason of Tenant's default, including any damages or deficiency accruing before or after forceable detainer action or other re-entry by Landlord. If Tenant shall fully and faithfully comply with all the terms, provisions, covenants and conditions of this Lease, the security, or any balance thereof, shall be returned to Tenant within thirty (30) days after the expiration or termination of this Lease. Whenever and as often as the amount of the security held by Landlord shall be diminished by Landlord's application thereof, Tenant shall, within (ten) 10 days after Landlord's request therefor, deposit additional money with Landlord sufficient to restore the security to its original amount unless Landlord agrees in writing to any diminished security deposit. In the absence of evidence satisfactory to Landlord of an assignment of the right to receive the security, or the remaining balance thereof, Landlord may return the security to the original Tenant, regardless of one or more assignments of the Lease itself.

ARTICLE VI Landlord Default

Section 6.01. Notice and Opportunity to Cure. Landlord shall in no event be in default in the performance of any of its obligations hereunder unless and until Landlord shall have failed to perform such obligations within thirty (30) days, or such additional time as is reasonably required to correct any such default, after notice by Tenant to Landlord properly specifying wherein Landlord has failed to perform any such obligation.

ARTICLE VII Tenant Default and Landlord's Remedies

- Section 7.01. Events of Default. Tenant shall be in default hereunder in any of the following events.
- A. If Tenant shall fail to pay any Base Rent, Additional Rent or other charge required to be paid by Tenant under this Lease within five (5) days of the date the same is due and payable; or
- B. If Tenant shall default in the performance of any of the other obligations and agreements of this Lease, and such default shall not have been remedied within thirty (30) days after written notice of Landlord to Tenant specifying such default and requiring it to be remedied; or
- C. If Tenant shall abandon the premises or fail to operate the Premises for the use permitted hereunder or leave them vacant for more than thirty (30) consecutive days during this Lease term; or
- D. If an execution, attachment, lien or other encumbrance shall be issued against Tenant and its property and such shall not be vacated or removed within thirty (30) days after the issuance thereof.

Section 7.02. <u>Landlord's Option to Terminate</u>. If Tenant becomes in default as defined in Section 7.01, Landlord may terminate this Lease upon written notice to Tenant, in which event all rights of Tenant hereunder shall expire and terminate and Tenant shall surrender the Premises on the date of such termination, and Tenant shall remain liable as herein provided.

Section 7.03. <u>Tenant Not Released</u>. In the event of termination of this Lease as provided herein, Tenant shall not be released or discharged but shall remain and continue liable to Landlord in a sum equal to all Base Rent, Additional Rent and other charges then due and shall be liable for all damages provided for hereunder and all costs, and reasonable attorney's fees incurred by Landlord as a result of Tenant's default.

Section 7.04. Landlord's Remedies.

- A. Re-entry: In the event of termination, Landlord may re-enter the Premises using such force as may reasonably be required without being liable for prosecution or damages on account of such re-entry, and may possess and repossess the Premises by summary proceedings, ejectment or otherwise. Tenant hereby waives any right to a jury trial in any eviction or forceable entry and detainer proceedings.
- B. Repair and Alteration: Landlord may repair or alter the Premises as reasonably necessary to render them in tenantable condition.
- C. <u>Lease and Release</u>: Landlord may lease or release the Premises or any portion thereof for the whole or the remainder of the original Lease term or for a longer period in Landlord's name or as agent for Tenant.
- D. <u>Damages</u>: If this Lease is terminated under the provisions of this Article or in the event of the termination of this Lease, or of re-entry, by or under any summary dispossession or other proceeding or action or any provision of law by reason of default hereunder on the part of Tenant, Tenant shall pay to Landlord as damages, at the election of Landlord, in addition to all Base Rent, Additional Rent and other charges then due and payable under this Lease, either:
 - (i) a sum which at the time of such termination of this Lease or at the time of any such re-entry by Landlord, if any, equals the excess of (1) the aggregate of the Base Rent and the Additional Rent payable hereunder which would have been payable by Tenant (conclusively presuming the Additional Rent to be the same as was payable either for the Lease Year preceding or during or the Lease Year immediately following such termination) for the period commencing with such earlier termination of this Lease or the date of any such re-entry, as the case may be, and ending with the expiration date, had this Lease not so terminated or had Landlord not so re-entered the Premises, over (2) the aggregate rental value of the Premises for the same period after considering and deducting reasonable projections of vacancy rates and costs of leasing and making the Premises acceptable to new tenant; or
 - (ii) sums equal to the Base Rent and the Additional Rent (as above presumed) payable hereunder which would have been payable by Tenant had this Lease not

so terminated, or had Landlord not so re-entered the Premises payable upon the due date therefor specified herein following such termination or such re-entry and until the expiration date; provided, however, that if Landlord shall re-let the Leased Premises during said period, Landlord shall credit Tenant with the net rents received by Landlord from such reletting, such net rents to be determined by first deducting from the gross rents as and when received by Landlord from such reletting, the expenses incurred or paid by Landlord in terminating this Lease or in re-entering the Premises and in securing possession thereof, including reasonable attorney's fees, as well as the expenses of re-letting.

All damages payable under this paragraph (D) shall be in addition to all Base Rent and Additional Rent accrued and payable at the time of such termination or re-entry and shall also be in addition to all expenses, damages and costs thereafter becoming due under this Article.

- E. Other Damages. Tenant agrees to pay on demand, in addition to all charges hereunder, or in the event of termination of this Lease, then in addition to damages under Section 7.04(D): (a) all of Landlord's expenses including reasonable attorney's fees incurred in enforcing any of the obligations of Tenant under this Lease, or in evicting Tenant or in collecting any amount due hereunder or in exercising any rights or remedies under this Lease or in Landlord consenting to any action of Tenant for which the Lease requires Landlord's consent; and (b) late charges incurred from the nonpayment of such Base Rent, Additional Rent, damages, charges and expenses at the rate of 18% per annum of such amounts; and (c) all expenses arising out of any termination of this Lease, all costs incurred in collecting charges, expenses and damages due from Tenant under this Lease, including all attorney's fees of Landlord, and all expenses of Landlord in attempting to re-lease the premises or parts thereof including advertising, attorney and brokerage fees, and cleaning and remodeling expenses.
- F. <u>Suits to Recover Deficiency</u>. Suits for recovery of any deficiency or for damages or for a sum equal to any installment or installments of any rent, expense or charges may be brought by Landlord from time to time after Tenant is in default at Landlord's option. Landlord shall not be required to await the date whereon the term of this Lease would have expired in the event of Tenant's default or termination pursuant to paragraph 7.02.
- G. Remedies Cumulative. The rights and remedies given to Landlord in this Lease are distinct, separate, and cumulative remedies. The existence of these remedies shall not be deemed to be in exclusion of any other remedies provided at law or in equity. Exercise of any one such remedy shall not be deemed a waiver or such other remedies as may be available.
- H. Receipt of Monies Not Waiver. The receipt of rent or other monies by Landlord from Tenant with knowledge of any breach or default on the party of Tenant shall not be deemed a waiver of such default. The receipt of rent or other monies by Landlord from Tenant after termination of this Lease shall not be deemed to reinstate, continue, or extend the term of this Lease or to affect any notice previously provided Tenant or to operate as a waiver of Landlord's right to recover any damages or other amounts due hereunder or possession of the Premises.

ARTICLE VIII

Landlord's Right to Cure Tenant's Default

Section 8.01. Right to Cure. If Tenant defaults in the performance of any agreement or obligation under this Lease and fails to cure such default after notice as provided herein, Landlord may, at its option, either before or after any termination of this Lease, and without waiving its claim for damages for such breach, cure such breach on behalf of Tenant. Any amount paid or any liability incurred by Landlord in curing a default of Tenant under this Article shall be deemed paid or incurred on account of Tenant and Tenant shall reimburse Landlord therefor or save Landlord harmless therefrom together with interest thereon at the rate of 18% per annum, and in addition, Tenant shall reimburse Landlord for all costs and reasonable attorney's fees incurred in curing a default.

ARTICLE IX Casualty Damage and Eminent Domain

Section 9.01. <u>Damage or Destruction</u>. In case the Premises shall be damaged by fire or other casualty so as to render the same untenantable in whole or in part for any period, a just abatement of rent shall be made until the same shall be repaired by the Landlord, provided, however, that if, in the Landlord's sole discretion, the Premises shall be so badly damaged by fire or any other casualty that the Landlord shall not desire to rebuild, this Lease shall terminate at the Landlord's option and rent shall be apportioned to the time of such termination. Further, in case the Premises shall be damaged by fire or other casualty so as to render the same untenantable in whole or in part for any period, Landlord shall not be liable for interruption to Tenant's business or for damage to or replacement or repair of Tenant's personal property (including, without limitation, inventory, trade fixtures, floor coverings, furniture and other property removable by Tenant under the provisions of this Lease) or any leasehold improvements installed in the Premises by Tenant resulting therefrom, all of which damage shall be repaired and replaced by Tenant promptly, unless this Lease is terminated at Landlord's election. Notwithstanding the foregoing, if the Premises are not restored completely by Landlord within one hundred eighty (180) days of such fire or other casualty, this Lease shall thereupon be deemed to have terminated.

Section 9.02. Eminent Domain. If all or a substantial portion of the Premises are taken or condemned by a duly constituted public authority, both Landlord and Tenant shall have the right to terminate this Lease upon giving written notice of termination to the other within thirty (30) days of the terminating party's receipt of notice of taking from the public authority. If the Lease is so terminated, the rent shall be apportioned and paid to the effective date of termination. In the event this Lease shall not be terminated as provided herein, rent shall abate proportionately as to the portion so taken based on the value of the portion so taken in relation to the value of the Premises immediately prior to the taking and the relative impact of the taking on the Tenant's business.

The Landlord shall be entitled to receive the entire award or awards in any condemnation proceeding without deduction therefrom for any estate vested in the Tenant and the Tenant shall receive no part of any award or awards from the Landlord or in the proceedings and the Tenant hereby assigns to the Landlord any and all of its right, title and interest in or to such award or awards or any part thereof.

Section 9.03. <u>Duty to Restore</u>. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary, in event of any such casualty, Tenant shall be obligated to use diligent and proper efforts to put the premises or the building in proper condition for use and occupation and to restore the Premises to substantially the same condition as existed prior to such casualty, all such restoration to be completed within 180 days of any such casualty.

Section 9.04. <u>Landlord's Entitlement to Damages</u>. Landlord reserves and excepts all rights to damages to said Premises and building and the leasehold hereby created, accrued or subsequently accruing by reason of anything lawfully done in pursuance of any public, or other, authority; and by way of confirmation, Tenant grants to Landlord all Tenant's rights to such damages and covenants to execute and deliver such further instruments of assignment thereof as Landlord may from time to time request; provided, however, then Landlord agrees to make such proceeds available to reimburse Tenant for costs incurred by Tenant in restoring the Premises.

ARTICLE X Limitations of Liability

Section 10.01. Landlord's Liability Limited. Landlord and its agents, employees and contractors shall not be liable for any injury to any person or damage to property due to the building in which Premises are located being in need of repair or due to the happening of any accident in or about the Premises, or due to any act or neglect of Tenant or of any employee, patron or visitor of Tenant. This provision applies without limitation to injury or damage caused by Tenant's sale, furnishing and/or consumption of alcohol, nature, rain, snow, ice, wind, frost, water, steam, gas, or odors in any form or by the bursting or leaking of windows, doors, walls, ceilings, floors, pipes, gutters, or other fixtures and to damage or injury caused by fixtures, furnishings, equipment and the like situated at the Premises whether owned by Tenant or others.

ARTICLE XI Notice and Waiver

Section 11.01. Written Notice Requested. All notices required to be given under this Lease shall be made in writing; oral notice shall be ineffective for all purposes.

Section 11.02. <u>Delivery of Notice</u>. Written notice shall have been delivered duly served if mailed by Certified Mail, Return Postage Requested, postage prepaid to Tenant and to Landlord at the following addresses:

Section 11.03. <u>Waiver</u>. No waiver of any default shall be deemed effective unless in writing signed by the party making the waiver. No waiver of any breach, covenant, condition, obligation or duty shall be construed a waiver of any other breach of the same or any other covenant, condition, obligation or duty.

ARTICLE XII Amendment, Modification and Renewal

Section 12.01. <u>Writing Required</u>. No amendment, modification, or renewal of this Lease shall be binding unless evidenced by an agreement in writing signed by Landlord and Tenant.

Section 12.02. <u>Hold-over Tenant</u>. If Tenant shall hold over as a Tenant after the expiration of the terms of this Lease, such tenancy shall be deemed to continue on a month-to-month basis and Tenant shall remain fully bound under all terms and conditions of this Lease, provided, however, the rent shall be twice the Base Rent in effect during the last month of the term hereof. This Section shall not be construed to give Tenant any right to hold over.

ARTICLE XIII Miscellaneous

Section 13.01. <u>Interpretation</u>. This Lease shall be construed in accordance with the law of the State of Maine. Whenever the context requires, the singular number includes the plural number and vice versa, the masculine gender includes the feminine gender and vice versa, the neuter gender includes the masculine and feminine gender. If Tenant includes more than one person or party, Tenant's obligations shall be joint and several. Time is of the essence in the performance of the terms and conditions of this Lease.

Section 13.02. <u>Captions</u>. Captions of paragraphs of this Lease are solely for convenience and shall not be deemed part of this Lease for any purpose.

Section 13.03. <u>Exhibits</u>. All exhibits attached to this Lease have been initialed by the parties for purposes of identification.

Section 13.04. <u>Partial Invalidity</u>. If any provision of this Lease shall be held invalid or unenforceable, the remaining provisions shall remain valid and enforceable to the fullest extent permitted by law.

Section 13.05. Successors and Assigns; Landlord Liability. The covenants and agreements of Landlord and Tenant shall run with the land and be binding upon and inure to the benefit of them and their respective heirs, executors, administrators, successors and assigns. No covenant or agreement of Landlord shall be binding upon any such heir, executor, administrator, successor, and assign except for defaults occurring during such person's period of ownership nor binding individually upon any fiduciary, shareholder, or beneficiary under any trust. "Landlord" means only the owner or the mortgagee in possession for the time being of the building in which the Premises are located so that in the event of any sale of said building or an assignment of this

Lease, Landlord shall be and hereby is entirely released and discharged from any and all further liability and obligations of Landlord hereunder, except any that may have theretofore accrued. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary provided in this Lease, if landlord or any successor in interest of Landlord shall be a mortgagee, or individual, joint venture, tenancy in common, corporation, firm or partnership (general or limited), it is specifically understood and agreed that there shall be absolutely no personal liability on the part of such mortgagee, corporation or such individual or on the part of the members of such firm, partnership or joint venture, or any stockholder, officer, director or trustee of such corporation with respect to any of the terms, covenants and conditions of this Lease, and that Tenant shall look solely to the equity of Landlord or such successor in interest in the Premises for the satisfaction of each and every remedy of Tenant in the event of any breach by Landlord or by such successor in interest of any of the terms, covenants and conditions of this Lease to be performed by Landlord, such exculpation of personal liability to be absolute and without any exception whatsoever.

Section 13.06. <u>Recordation</u>. This Lease shall not be recorded. If requested by Tenant, Landlord shall prepare a separate memorandum of lease in conformance with Maine law.

Section 13.07. <u>Duplicate Originals</u>. This Lease has been executed in two (2) or more copies, each of which shall be considered an original for all purposes.

Section 13.08 Entire Agreement. This Lease and the attached Appendices A, B and C contain the complete and entire agreement of the parties.

Section 13.09. Estoppel Certificate. The Tenant agrees, at any time, and from time to time, upon no less than ten (10) days prior request by Landlord, at Landlord's expense, to execute, acknowledge and deliver to Landlord a statement in writing certifying, if such be the case, that this Lease is unmodified and in full force and effect (or, if there have been modifications, stating the modifications, and that the Lease as modified is in full force and effect), stating the amounts and dates to which the Base Rent and Additional Rent, and other charges have been paid and stating whether or not to the best knowledge of Tenant there exists any default in the performance of any covenant, agreement, term, provision or condition contained in this Lease, and if so specifying each such default, it being intended that any such statement delivered pursuant to this Article may be relied upon by any prospective purchaser of, or any prospective holder of a mortgage upon the premises by any other property interested party.
